John is a recently retired corporate executive who is very interested in helping to maintain Pelican Bay's position as a premier community. His business experience was primarily in automotive manufacturing and package delivery. John was one of the four individuals who created Roadway Package System (now FedEx Ground), serving initially as its chief financial officer and later as its president. He has both a BBA and an MBA from the University of Michigan and obtained his CPA designation from the State of Illinois.

(ARCO today). Ten years later, he returned to the U.S. and began his banking career from which he took early retirement as a SVP of a German Bank in New York in 1986.

John and his wife, Maida, then moved to Pelican Bay in 1987, leaving behind three children and seven grandchildren. Here they formed a stock photography agency which expanded with an office in Atlanta. In 1994, they sold the company and re-retired.

Since that time, he has served on the Boards of the PBPOA and MAG; seven years on the PBSB, including two years as Chair of the Clam Bay Committee; and has been active in the Pelican Bay Community Emergency Response Team. Outside of Pelican Bay, he served two terms as Treasurer at

St. John's Episcopal Church, as well as its Finance Committee. Maida and John also found time to start a not-for-profit cultural society which holds 12 events per year – of which he is Treasurer.

My personal goal in this position is to manage and control costs. To that end, our budget for 2010 was adopted with no increase in assessments for Pelican Bay residents. I look forward to continuing this result in 2011.

Since being on the Board, I have realized the importance of rebuilding the credibility of the Board and improving relations with the County so that they will be more supportive of Pelican Bay in the continued management of Clam Bay and the mangroves in particular. To that end, I have spent many hours attending and participating in meetings with other advisory committees, the County Manager and the BCC. I intend to continue these activities that will benefit Pelican Bay in the future.
